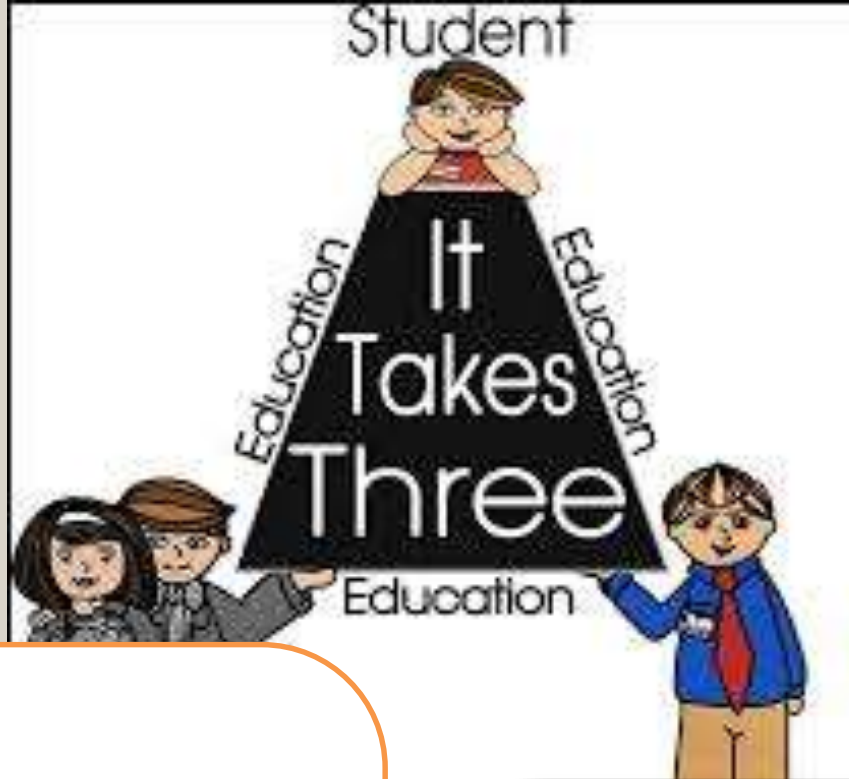

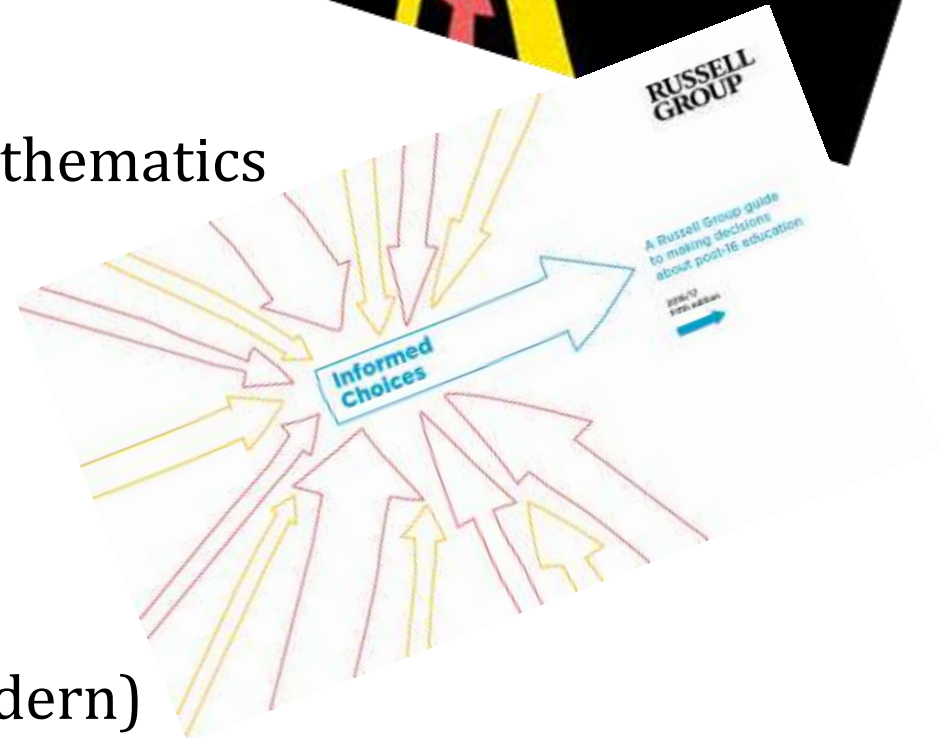
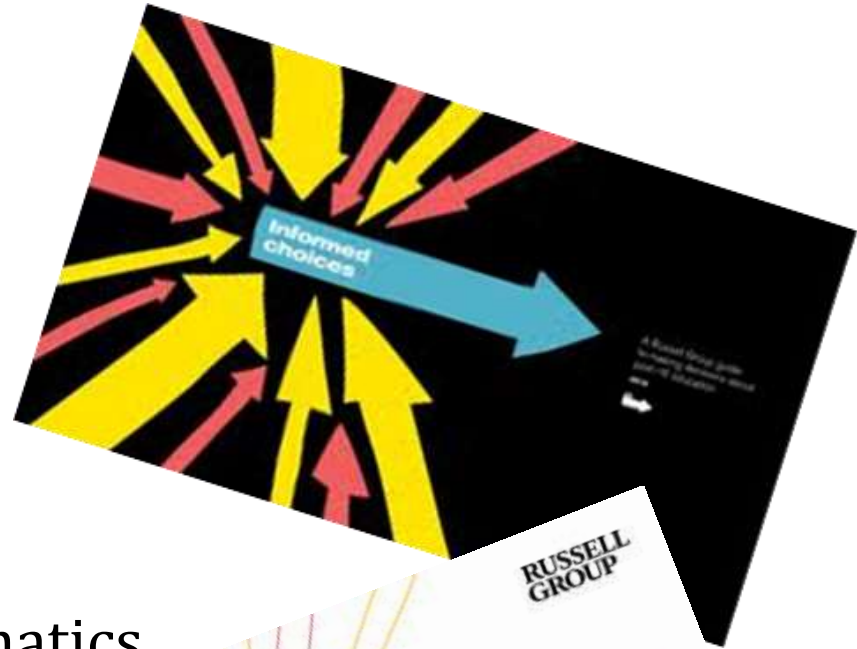

Sixth Forms and Further Education Colleges – What do they have to offer?



Further Education Colleges

These colleges provide a variety of options. Students can study A Levels or a vocational equivalent; this could be an NVQ, City & Guilds Diploma or BTEC Level Diploma. Courses available include studies in Sports, Construction and Technical Studies, Early Years, Health and Social Care and Music. This type of college may be suitable for those who want a less academic route to further study and qualifications.

Sixth Form Colleges

A more academic route than FE colleges, Sixth Form Colleges offer a range of AS/A level subjects, BTEC courses and GCSE resits. The Sixth Form College provides a more adult experience than school sixth forms. There are often Advanced Graduate Programmes run at these colleges to help students to go on to study at university level. Students need to be self-regulating and have good independent learning skills in order to succeed at Sixth Form College.

School Sixth Forms

School Sixth Forms are a good option for students who want an academic route and like the structure of the secondary school system. Some will follow the International Baccalaureate Programme of study which is highly regarded by universities. Students need to be self-regulating and have good independent learning skills in order to succeed.

Grammar School Sixth Forms

These follow the selective system of the Kent Grammar schools. As part of the application process students may have to sit an entrance exam in addition to achieving good grades in at least 6 GCSE full course subjects. This will nearly always include a minimum of Grade 4 in English and maths and at least a Grade 6/7 in the subjects for study at A level.

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If you wish to study Maths , Chemistry or Physics A Levels you will need a grade 6 minimum.

Grade 5 is considered a good pass.

Grade 4 is a low pass.

Below grade 3 we mean limited college options and re-sitting maths.

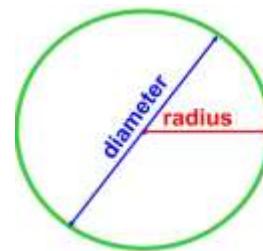
Grade 2 or below will lead to BTEC/ basic skills re-sits at college.



Formulae required at the Foundation tier that are not to be provided on a formula sheet include:	• Pythagoras' theorem	$a^2 = b^2 + c^2$
	• trigonometric ratios	$\sin\theta = \frac{o}{h}, \cos\theta = \frac{a}{h}, \tan\theta = \frac{o}{a}$
	• area of a trapezium	$\frac{1}{2}(a+b)h$
	• volume of a prism	(area of cross section) \times length

Formulae required at the Higher tier that are not to be provided on a formula sheet include:	• the quadratic formula	$x = \frac{-b \pm \sqrt{b^2 - 4ac}}{2a}$
	• the sine rule	$\frac{a}{\sin A} = \frac{b}{\sin B} = \frac{c}{\sin C}$
	• the cosine rule	$a^2 = b^2 + c^2 - 2bc \cos A$
	• area of a triangle	$\frac{1}{2}ab \sin C$

Circles appear on both papers



Area of a circle
= $\pi \times$ **radius**²

Circumference of a circle = $\pi \times$ **diameter**

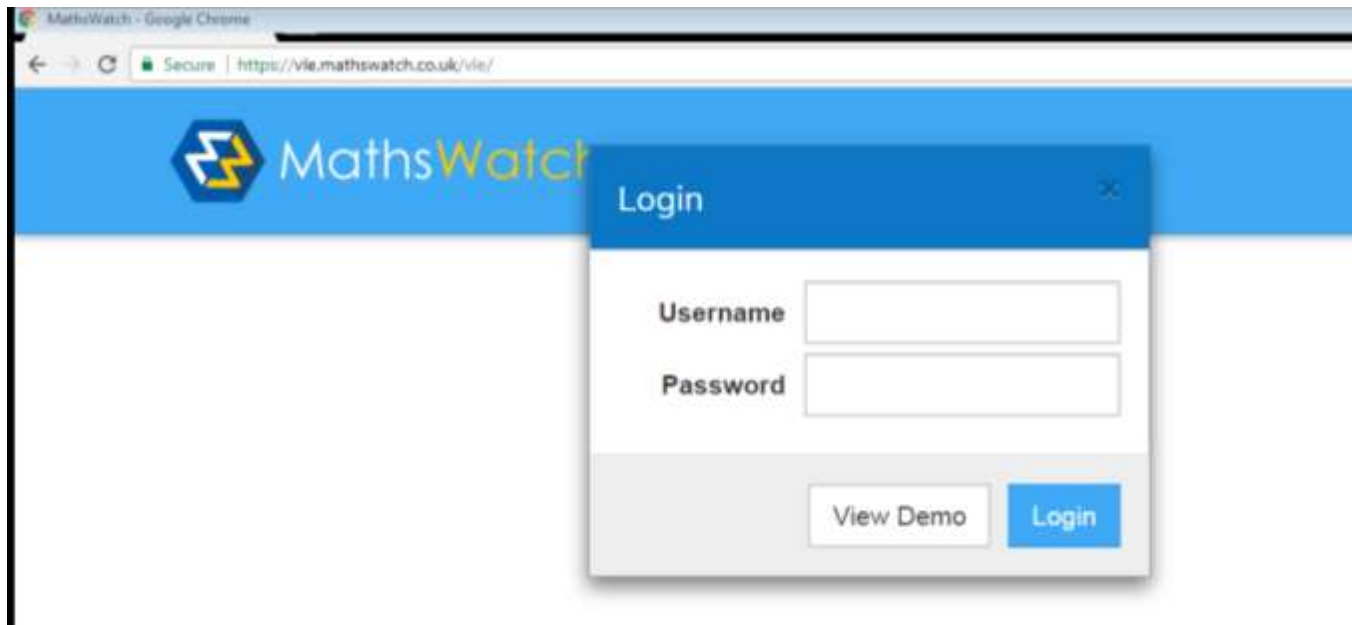
remember that the **diameter** = **2 x radius**

There are 4 main tools we recommend for revision



- 1) Mathswatch (analysis sheets)
- 2) Corbett maths, 5 a day
- 3) Past papers , these are obviously limited for new GCSE!
- 4) Revision books, these are available for sale from the maths office

Mathswatch: This should be used in conjunction with analysis sheets, past papers and to consolidate topics covered in lessons.

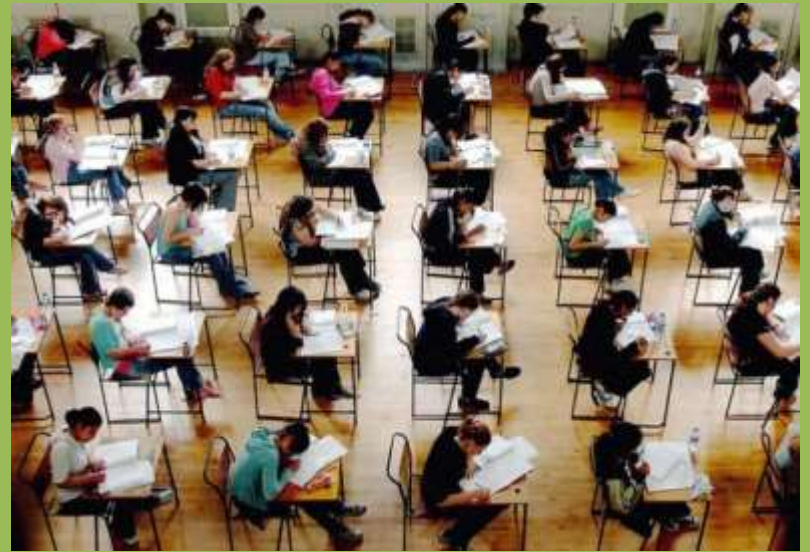

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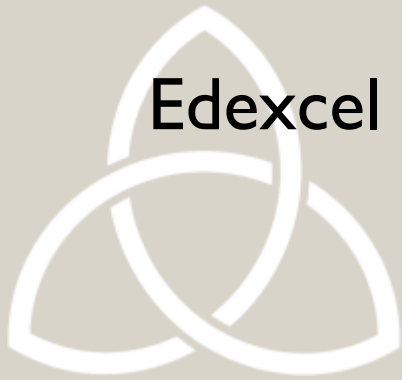

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How can you help your child with their RE revision?

Help them learn their key word definitions **word for word** and keep testing them

e.g. **Humanism** = a belief that people's spiritual and emotional needs can be satisfied without religion.

e.g. **Glossolalia** = Speaking in an unknown language, or tongues, during religious worship.

Make sure past exam questions are being answered – the more the better!!

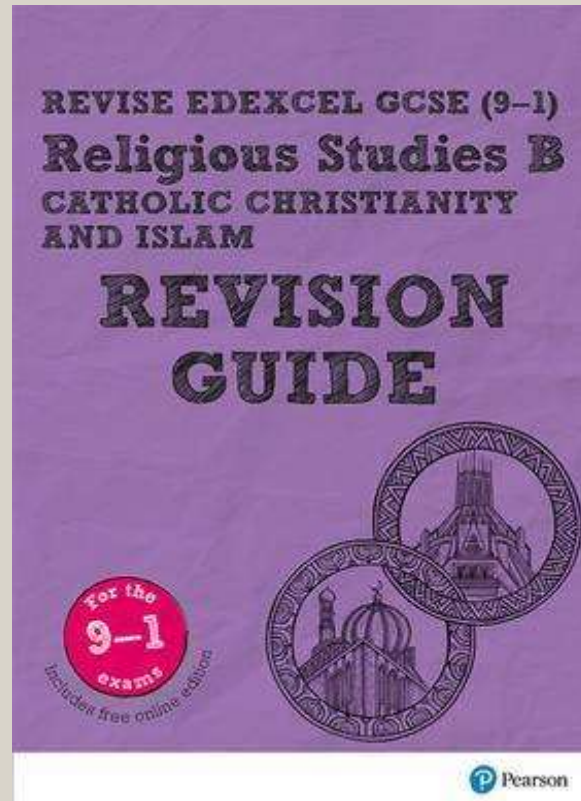
