Message from our Chair of Governors

Dear Parents & Carers

I would like to start by saying how great it has been to see the pupils back in their learning environment over the past week.

It was extremely unfortunate that our pupils and staff did not have the start to term that the school had planned and hoped for and we recognise that the delayed reopening was concerning. But the school opening was delayed due to safety concerns for our whole school community. which takes priority over all other considerations.

One key aspect of our role as a governing body is monitoring and evaluating the school and acting as a source of challenge and support. As Chair I am in regular contact with Mr Lucas, which was heightened during the closure. Over that period, as a wider group, we were present at a number of risk assessment meetings and a full board meeting to scrutinise the process followed and the advice received. We fully supported the decision made. We also re-explored the risk assessment for whole school opening to establish what else the school could do with the benefit of hindsight. Although there is always an element of risk, we are confident that the already robust and comprehensive measures we had agreed before the end of last term have been appropriately supplemented and additional guidance has been provided to staff. Prior to reopening, two governors conducted a health and safety focussed site visit to ensure measures were in place as intended. They were satisfied with the clear signage, layout of rooms, obvious thorough cleaning and availability of sanitiser and wipes.

I hope your family's own experience of the measures in place to keep students safe has provided reassurance that the school is prioritising the safety of our community and adhering to Government guidelines. A wide range of steps have been taken to ensure year group bubbles do not mix and high levels of hygiene are maintained across both sites by students and staff alike. We were already in the fortunate position to offer additional classes across the secondary phase to reduce the number of pupils in each class. The primary and secondary site layout means separate social areas for staff in each year group bubble have been provided for use during breaks to avoid contact with other bubbles.

We would like to acknowledge the efforts of staff who remotely provided home learning and are working hard to support children to have a positive experience in unfamiliar circumstances now they are back in school.

Our shared priority is to provide high quality learning for all students and to help them through this challenging time. We are all facing testing times and stresses and we are grateful for your ongoing support. If you do have specific concerns or queries please do contact the school. 
CHAPLAIN'S CORNER By Miss S Alder



KNOWLEDGE ORGANISERS & HOMEWORK



what is a knowledge organiser?

Knowledge organisers are a book that sets out the **important**, **useful** and **powerful knowledge** of a single topic on one page.

When used effectively, Knowledge Organisers are useful for:

- •Helping build a foundation of factual knowledge.
- •Embedding revision techniques for now and future studies (A-Level, College, University)
- •Allowing knowledge to become stored in **long term memory** which frees up working memory for more complex ideas. It also allows you to connect concepts together, even across subjects

How much knowledge organiser homework does my child need to do?

- -EACH NIGHT students should spend *at least* **1 hour** per night on homework. 3 subjects per night x 20 minutes per subject= 1 hour. The homework **timetables** in page 2 are a guide to what subjects to complete each night.
- **-Complete all work in your exercise book** and make sure you bring your knowledge organiser to school EVERYDAY (in your coloured folder). All Knowledge Organiser homework is checked by Family Group Leaders on Fridays.

Should my child be completing any other homework?

- -For students in years 9-11, your individual teachers will also set additional homework for your child to complete.
- -Students in years 7-8 will be assigned **ENGLISH** reading activities on www.CommonLit.org with each assignment taking 20-30 minutes to complete and **MATHS** activities with short explanatory videos on the online platform of https://mathswatch.co.uk -It is recommended that **ALL** students regularly **READ** a variety of **fiction and non-fiction books** of their choosing. This extra reading will develop and broaden general understanding and context in all subjects.
- It is also recommended to **ALL** students to take advantage of FREE online revision tools such as <u>www.senecalearning.com</u> or the recently updated BBC BITESIZE.

How do I use the knowledge organisers?

Students will be taught specific retrieval practice techniques in Family Group Time and throughout lessons. These are guided by educational research and the *Science of Learning*.

NHS Test and Trace COVID-19 app – resources for schools, parents and young people

Today, NHS Test and Trace has launched the <u>NHS COVID-19 app</u>. The app has been launched to help control the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). It will do this by alerting people who may have been exposed to infection so that they can take action.

The app is available to download on smartphones for anyone aged 16 or over. This means that some students in year 11, students in years 12, 13 and in further education colleges will be eligible to use the app and benefit from its features. In addition to the guidance for schools and further education colleges which we published yesterday, NHS Test and Trace has published guidance and resources to support the use of the app which are available to download.
