Adassa (RE)	Max (2V)

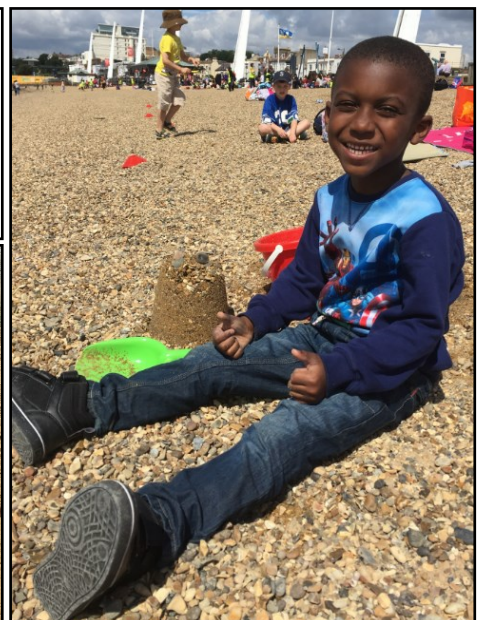
We hope the list will get considerably larger next year!
