Jesus said to [the Samaritan woman], "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty. John 4: 13-15

ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL WOMEN IN ENGINEERING DAY



In recognition of the Annual International Women in Engineering Day, June 23, a group of thirty year 7, 8 and 9 Trinitarians, accompanied by Mr Hutton and Miss Newsome, made a trip to the Emirates Aviation Experience in North Greenwich to Celebrate. Pupils learned about the history of some of female pioneers in Aviation and Engineering and the contributions they have made to the industry. They were taught how to fly the Airbus A380 and Boeng777 in the flight simulator school and worked together in groups to manoeuvre the aircraft, which we learned was valued at over £250million and could carry up to 800 passengers! Representatives from Rolls Royce were on hand to guide pupils in aircraft and engine design competitions and explain to pupils some of the options they have for starting a career in Aviation and Engineering.

This is the student report, a weekly section of the newsletter, where we discuss the events taking place in the student's week at Trinity Secondary School.

This week, I will discuss Sports Day, Activities Week, and Extra-Curricular Activities around the school and briefly discuss the finish of end of year exams.



Firstly, Sports Day will be taking place on Monday the 1st of July (Next Monday) at Sutcliffe Park in the secondary phase. All students will be expected to be wearing their white PE polo shirt with the house colour clearly represented and a choice of leg wear. The leg wear can represent your house colour however it is not a requirement for Sports Day whether you are participating or not. Students should arrive at school at 8am and will leave Sutcliffe Park by 1pm. Also, this year's sports day will be the last run in the current format. As of next year onwards, there will be a full sports tournament for year 5-8 at Sutcliffe Park as well as the current carousel of activities for year Reception to year 4 at Manor Gardens and a separate event for year 9 and 10.



The week after Sports Day, the school will be hosting their first ever Activities Week. For the week, normal lessons will not proceed and instead students will be participating in activities they have chosen to do beforehand. Pupils across the Secondary Phase are able to pick trips and events for the week well in advance. This includes residential trips to the UK / Europe as well as specific subject activities for the whole week. This will take place specifically from Monday the 8th of July to Thursday the 12th of July. On the Friday of Activities Week, all students will come together for Diversity Day – The Big Trinity Picnic! All pupils will be going to Greenwich Park for a picnic. It is encouraged that students bring food linked to their heritage and culture. Also students will participate in a range of activities celebrating cultural, ethnic, religious and social diversity. Students are encouraged to wear clothing that represents their cultural background. Students are expected to arrive at school by 9:30am and will be dismissed from Greenwich Park by 2pm.
