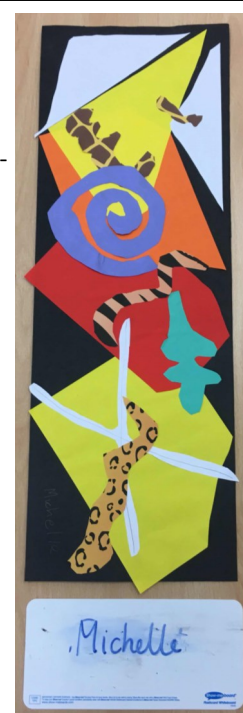
### Fair Trade Banana Muffins!
