To our wonderful Trinity family

Blue skies and sunshine have certainly welcomed us back to Lent term 2. We are now over halfway through this academic year and, with only five more teaching weeks to Easter, the focus on final preparations for public examinations with pupils across the school is in full swing. We have assessment weeks for many year groups coming up (year 7-10 over the next 3 weeks and then the primary just before Easter), which are used to help inform us of where pupils are to ensure we can tailor the support for each individual. We have had an amazing week and have been extremely excited about all the events and activities that have occurred.

This week has been the first week of our Trinity Futures fortnight. This has involved NatWest running Money Sense workshops from year 1 right up and including year 5. This has looked at the differences between wants and needs, planning a party and even year 5 becoming Fraud Scene Investigators. Year 9 had a work shop from the Young Enterprise organisation, looking at entrepreneurial skills as well as a Careers Speed Networking activity that was fast paced and fun ensuring pupils were able to talk to specialists from over 20 different career paths. We have also had many guest speakers across the school talking to our pupils, including a TV presenter, the police force, a Capital FM DJ and Queens University. We have also had apprenticeship workshops, a Stock Market challenge and a large group of year 8 visiting Goldsmiths University. Next week we have a group going to the London School of Economics (LSE), an Architecture workshop, the London fire brigade visiting us as well as several CV and interview technique master classes to name but a few.

To help push our academically able pupils we had Potential Plus work with a group of parents from across year 7 and 8. Looking at the characteristics of the more able and giving useful techniques of how parents can further support and guide the talents of their children at home. On top of this we have signed up to the Royal Geographical Lectures which are open for all to come and listen to. We want all our pupils to live life in all its fullness – as our vision says. Let's help pupils feed their curiosity about the world around them by exploring what the experts in the field are looking at.

Alongside the academic push we also encourage our pupils to take part in sporting activities and the arts. We had a group of pupils take part in a Wallball tournament this week. They had never played the game before, so in the morning they learned from the coaches and in the afternoon they were challenged in a tournament. They had to be resilient to start with, reflective to help them improve and then use the knowledge to excel in a tournament. The team were open minded and worked well as a team. Consequently they won. Perseverance can make a difference – what amazing Trinitarians they are.

Can I remind parents of year 7-11 that the pupils should be spending quality time each night on their Knowledge Organisers (Year 7 it should be at least 60 minutes, Year 8 75 minutes and Year 9 and above at least 90 minutes). They need to be practicing their retrieval of the knowledge they are accumulating over time. This ensures it moves from their working memory to their long term memory. Please use these Knowledge Organiser booklets to test them at home to ensure they are developing the required knowledge to enable them to progress. Your support will make a huge difference.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER By Reverend Juliet Evans

One day Jesus got into a boat with his disciples, and he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side of the lake.' So they put out, and while they were sailing he fell asleep. A gale swept down on the lake, and the boat was filling with water, and they were in danger. They went to him and woke him up, shouting, 'Master, Master, we are perishing!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and the raging waves; they ceased, and there was a calm. He said to them, 'Where is your faith?' They were afraid and amazed, and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that he commands even the winds and the water, and they obey him?'

Luke 8: 22-25

In Trinity worship this week we have been reflecting on the story of Jesus calming a storm.

In the primary school we noticed that when the disciples were scared they asked Jesus for help. We thought about many of our fears and how they can get really big if we don't address them. So we discussed who we can ask to help us with our worries. We also noticed that Jesus asked the disciples where their faith was and reflected together how we can have courage to overcome our fears ourselves.

In the secondary school we are in Futures Week and so we thought about the things which can worry us about life ahead and how there are many opportunities in Trinity to help us engage with life in all its fullness beyond school. We also thought about the storms in our world we are most worried about and we learnt about Greta Thunberg who is a courageous 16 year old climate campaigner. Greta reminds us that we have the power to help to create our own future and our own hope: "We do need hope—of course, we do. But the one thing we need more than hope is action. Once we start to act, hope is everywhere."







Next week commencing Monday 4th MARCH is **Assessment week for Year 7 & 8** – pupils in these Year Groups will be assessed in all subjects to give teachers the ongoing evidence they use to check progress and attainment. At Trinity our teaching and learning is based on the research around the use of retrieval practice, ongoing low stakes testing and regular constant mini-assessments which means that in the middle of the academic year for Years 7 & 8 we should be able to get a good picture of how well pupils are making use of their knowledge organisers, homework tasks and revision strategies in order to perform well in assessments. The most important thing is to constantly revise and go back over work covered in class to move this knowledge & understanding to one's long term memory in order to be able to use this information over and over again so it is embedded and can be accessed no matter how long ago it was taught.

Year 9 Assessment week is w/c Monday 18th March and Year 9 Parents Evening is Thursday 7th March, we look forward to welcoming all our Year 9 parents for this vital meeting to update you on your child's progress and achievement so far in their first year of their GCSE courses.

Year 10 Assessment Week is w/c Monday 11th March – A timetable for these exams for Year 10 is being finalised by Ms DiRicci and will be published to pupils and parents next week.

Year 8 have their Parents Evening and Options Choices on 19th March – an exciting time for them as they begin to think about the subjects they have an aptitude for to continue their studies with at GCSE. Pupils will have a series of assemblies given by Heads of Dept to explain what their subject involves at GCSE, small group interviews with a careers adviser and lots of help, support & advice from all staff in the run-up to them making their choices. There is a wide range of subjects to decide on and the idea is always that pupils are able to have this breadth to choose from so that when they leave Trinity to continue their studies elsewhere, all avenues of study are open to them thanks to the choices they were helped to make at GCSE at Trinity.



JACK PETCHEY FOUNDATION

One of the activities for this first week of Trinity Futures was the Jack Petchey Foundation together with Young Enterprise working with all of Year 9 on an Employability Masterclass. This half day event covered all sorts of skills and attributes needed to make sure that pupils present themselves in a confident & positive fashion and made them really think about what it is about them that makes them shine & stand out from the crowd. Well done Year 9 on great personal pitches!



DONMAR

Year Ten Drama students spent a day, courtesy of the Donmar Warehouse, exploring the possibilities of creating live sound on stage and fashioning storylines for a particular dramatic genre. It was a robust, creative day topped off by a spine tingling performance of the Donmar's current show, *Berberian Sound Studio* which challenged us all as an audience. Year Nine joined the Year Ten's for this experience which forced them to consider what it might be like when you can't understand everything going on around you (like the leading character) but have to try to find your (sometimes terrifying) way. They were an entirely delightful and engrossed audience!

Some impressive moments from the day were Jayden being unpacked from his superhero packaging by a perfectly paced Patience accompanied by the precise and spot-on sound generated by Foley artist Austeja's paper tearing and Martin's celery snapping. Nathaniel clearly needed answers so full of questions was he after the show and Kayla made sure she used the actor/director Q and A to get the answer to her burning question. Christian put his fatigue aside to enjoy the (very dark) comedy of the production.

On Tuesday 26th March, over 40 Year 10 students went to the historical Queen's College school in Harley Street to take part in a Stock Market Challenge. Trinity students were put in teams with Queen's College, and each took on the role of either Finance Manager, Media Analyst, Floor Trader or Investment Analyst. The aim of the game was to apply and develop their understanding of maths and use their reasoning skills by building up a portfolio of stocks and shares. Throughout the game there were regular "breaking news" items, fluctuating share prices, and daily news letters all of which the students could use to make informed decisions about which companies to invest in. Well done to Patrick Meehan and Tymothy Imurni for being part of the winning team, with an impressive final portfolio value of £1,984,940 (£1,084,940 in money and £900,000 in shares) from an initial investment of £15,000. Thank you to the staff of Queen's College, London for inviting us to take part in the day, and to Leila Barbaro for the fantastic photographs.


Edith received the award for 'Self Belief' and Nicole the award for 'Passion'.




Trinity Science Fair!
